The Authority's future strategic regeneration plans have recently been launched through the 'Hartlepool Vision', however it is recognised that this needs to be underpinned by consistent and high quality neighbourhood level regeneration and development activity. Working with VCS sector organisation to build their capacity to assist with, and offer a cost effective and sustainable solution to delivering community regeneration and development activity, as well as offer an innovative and creative approach to service delivery.

Dyke House, Hartlepool

North East

The new roundabout that was built to access the new housing estate is causing major problems especially for the health and safety of the children that attended the nearby school. The other issues that were highlighted were:- Environmental Maintenance Plan, Traffic Management Plan, the lack of play facilities for all ages and where they are sited in the village, Crime Prevention and Reduction. Project will look at these other issues identified at the Community Conference and let the residents of the village decide which issue to address and best ways to tackle it. This will form our development strategy and we will use the traffic problem model to address each issue.

Shotton Colliery

North East

Identify outcomes which the voluntary-led youth sector can meaningfully take forward. It may well be that additional support will be required to do this, particularly in terms of increasing the skills and capacity of volunteer youth workers, including some of the young people themselves.

Exploring new partnership methods to deliver youth work services

North East

Work closely with our community partners and the local authority to coordinate and target business support to local community groups, helping them to solve their own problems. Additionally support the development of a community led, multi agency, co-ordinated, Action Plan to take forward the key priorities that have already been identified through a series of comprehensive consultation exercises.

Benwell & Scotswood North East

Bring together not only the existing community groups, but those residents who have never engaged before, encouraging active citizenship. The key outcome will be an Action Plan that brings together all those with an interest in Deneside and will shape the delivery of services to the benefit of the area. The project is still at the early stages, however the aim is to assist the community to shape an action plan that will impact significantly on their estate.

Seaham: Deneside North East

Explore a pilot job creation / access to employment project for unemployed people , with the findings giving potential for extrapolation on a wider scale.

Project will work with Parish Council, GP Surgery, Community Police, Age UK Village Agent, South Lakeland District Council, Cumbria County Council, Ambleside Library, local councillors, local churches, Windermere Food Bank, local businesses, Stage Coach and other local and district wide voluntary organisations in order to develop affective strategies for supporting: itinerant homeless people, vulnerable older people who are isolated at home, migrant workers, Older men who are experiencing bereavement, redundancy, illness or disability including onset dementia or who are caring for another person.

Ambleside Parish Centre North West

This project will support the process of public service reform, and voluntary sector development, growth and innovation, within the Denton North East ward by bringing partners together to work on the main priority for local residents which is the provision of services and opportunities for children, young people and families (CYPF).

Denton North East

North West

The Project will build on the powerful community links and capacity building already carried out through GGO by drilling down further into the skill levels and training and employment needs of residents and co-ordinating activities to develop pathways to employment. It will develop links with not only the local business communities, local training providers, Winsford E-Act Academy and Mid Cheshire College to open up training opportunities and will also build on work already carried out with employers to open up opportunities to local people.

North West

A new neighbourhood activity based programme and planning partnership, to build a stronger community here in Walton. L4 Walton - A Better Place Initiative will: Nurture a bustling community hub focused on poverty, social exclusion, health and emotional well-being activity. Develop a popular education/cultural activities programme to increase local aspirations, develop confidence, improve citizenship and promote parenting skills. Establish a new Neighbourhood Planning Partnership of residents and key service providers to deliver new amenities and make services more efficient & accountable. Increase the involvement of young people (7/19 years) with WYP and their community. 'Develop safe' places where young people can meet. Rebuild relationships between young and older residents.

Walton Liverpool

North West

Project will develop a local area action plan with the intention of addressing a range of factors that currently, and historically, have a negative influence the area. These factors include; low employment, disengaged youth, anti-social behaviour and community safety. The project aims to identify and support natural community leaders that can become positive and influential mentors in the area.

Greenlands

North West

Roll out a full Public Service Reform approach in a locality within our borough to test what works and be clear about what really makes a difference to local people and to local agencies involved in delivering costly and sometimes complex but unconnected services to local people. The aim is to make local government relevant to our citizens and to forge a clear partnership and agreement between service providers and our customers. The programme has 5 key areas of focus, Early years, Troubled/stronger families (including complex dependencies), Worklessness and Skills, Health & Social Care, Restorative Justice.

Address isolation in the elderly through collaborative working to understand the needs of this population. It is to be delivered through working with other providers to clarify referral mechanisms and establish an understanding of needs in this area ultimately leading to services with information and signposting, support for individuals, group interventions and wider community engagement.

This will support the most vulnerable families, delivering better and more sustainable outcomes, and reduce demand on public services. In addition, this will look at the services for families who live outside the two main housing areas, where there are less voluntary services available to them.

The main outcomes are building self-esteem, emotional resilience, self-responsibility, life and pro-social skills.

Hastings into Work Partnership will create a collaborative joined-up approach to tackling unemployment in Hastings by bringing together local support providers within a formal partnership to help them share resources, secure investment, improve and develop new services and maximise impact. It aims to build on the initial work of the Employment Forum that Hastings Borough Council have led that will see the partnership attract resources, become more action orientated and develop community led solutions.

Having heard from 'community activists' and empowering emerging 'players' we will work together to understand what strategic approach to identify the gaps in service provision, along with horizon scanning and capacity building. In tandem it is proposed to concentrate on the identification of resources, including public budgets and community assets, to better align need with delivery and to build on current initiatives to pool resources within a 'whole system' approach to service delivery.

South East

The Love Dedworth project will be about improving lives for residents - making Dedworth a better place to live, which will be achieved primarily by addressing the causes of low employment and wellbeing. The project will aim to determine ambitious and innovative methods to bring positive change through confident action, newly found commitment and recognisable results.

South East

Ventnor Town Council is committed to co-ordinate the collaborative production of an Operational Plan by 31 March 2015 together with the town's communities, the agencies and organisations active in it and its private sector that by its implementation will lead to improved health and wellbeing, a renewed and refreshed economy and enhanced community capacity. The over-riding aim of the proposal is to stimulate activity in all three of those areas to begin the reversal of the cycle of decline that has already left half the town's population living in two Lower Super Output Areas. An important subsidiary aim of the proposal is to provide case study evidence and mentoring support in the battle against decline by other coastal towns on both the Isle of Wight and the mainland.

This project is about developing a sustainable set of community led solutions to issues of local concern that result in potentially high cost, fragmented public services. The priorities are yet to be fully defined but are based on work carried out with front-line agencies. Initial consultation indicates that residents and local groups would wish to explore how there can be greater awareness of the range of opportunities available in the community to participate in leisure and other activities to help address local need, -how community resilience can be built and sustained across all ages, -how work, digital skills and financial capabilities can be built across the community and individuals

South East

To provide a service for young people in the area that is managed locally and provides activities that are constructive, ambitious, aspirational and inspiring and which sets clear boundaries of behaviour and has high expectations of what our young people can achieve. This project will see a locally managed partnership engaging with and responding to local issues and supporting all areas of successful youth work; eg: sports clubs, drama groups, which traditionally have never been formally acknowledged as youth work by the IWC. Alongside this they will develop a strategy for developing greater youth engagement, empowerment of West Wight young people and the provision of fun activities that are stimulating and raise aspirations.

South East

The project is designed to identify and explore areas where the Police, Eastbourne Borough Council, and Eastbourne Homes can work together to improve their services to residents, avoiding duplication and making best use of resources. The ambition is to work with local residents and their representatives to develop a single service delivering improvements to the management of environmental issues and anti social behaviour. The project will explore the potential for this looking at what improvements are deliverable and building a business case showing any cost benefits which could in turn be deployed for further service improvements.

Eastbourne Town Centre

South East

The White Rock neighbourhood is full of unrealised potential. When the pier reopens in Summer 2015 it is expected that 325,000 new visitors will come to Hastings each year. It would be too easy for these people to stick to the seafront promenade between the pier and the Old Town and never come into the White Rock neighbourhood. Local businesses and residents want to make sure that the local area captures the economic opportunity of these new visitors.

This project is designed to deliver improvements to their health and well-being for rural residents in Wealden. The proposal is to recruit a series of "Village Connectors" across the district - local volunteers who would become an integrated, trusted and approachable member of the community to act as a link between local people, the local authority and services who can provide support. They would signpost residents to available services, support the development of local services and facilities including the development of appropriate local transport solutions.

The funding will allow us to start to tackle the lack of community cohesion/resilience in Central Bexhill by providing space, tools & support so that local residents can meet; develop their skills and knowledge; build confidence; design their own activities that encourage a sense of wellbeing, personal growth and community.

Newhaven Youth Forum aims to focus statutory, voluntary and local business sector resources and energy to meet the current needs of young people aged 9 to 25 as identified in the emerging Youth Strategy 2014: dedicated youth social space; youth information and advice provision including education, employability and skills support, healthy lifestyles including healthy eating and physical activity, addressing homelessness ; access to counselling and mental well-being support; addressing risky and antisocial behaviours including fire setting and sea safety; social space.

South East

This project aims to broaden the horizons of young people by improving life options, life choices and facilitating and supporting them on the road to achieving financial independence. This partnership will to work directly with young people to identify where they are hitting challenges, how services and support can be reconfigured to provide greater assistance to overcome the barriers they face.

North West Ward)

South East

The project aims to: - develop a vision and a plan of action for Romsey co-produced by the local community, local Councillors and local service providers - create a local 'brand' for Romsey - highlight opportunities for the town (e.g. funding through development) - bring partners together to pool expertise and resources, and to challenge themselves to think differently about the future service needs of the community and undertake a programme of transformation as a result.

Romsey Future

South East

Key Aim One - to expand a devolved environment management service that has been established in the Stewkley Parish over the past 15 months into a multiple Parish Cluster model involving up to 9 Parishes in the initial expansion. Key aim two: to investigate the expanding the range of services provided through the parish cluster social enterprise to include self-funded older persons services such as: befriending, garden maintenance, shopping, meals, house cleaning and tidying. A further aim is to expand into the funded adult social care provision and ensure local people service the needs of local service users.

Aylesbury Vale District Cluster South East

The driving aims are to nurture a more age-inclusive community, that is more resilient and responsive to the needs and age and social profile of the parish and is proactive in stimulating a healthy, caring and sustainable environment. The project is about transforming this approach into reality. To deliver these aims the project will need a suitable vehicle, and this is likely to be a new social enterprise CIC or local co-operative, but governance structure is to be determined.

Civil parish of Wye with
Hinxhill and surrounding area South East

The overall aim is to improve the health and wellbeing of young people in Weymouth through access to support and care from a range of voluntary and community groups. There is a wealth of small community groups and forums that provide targeted services to specific areas of health and social care such as healthy eating, teenage pregnancy and teenage parents, alcohol and other substance use as well as organisations which provide a voice for particular groups in decision making. This project is about bringing them together so that a local offer to act as a menu for GP's that can be used where conditions and thresholds are appropriate.

Weymouth South West

This project aims to create environmental, social and economic resilience, pooling the skills and resources of the Totnes community, including land and buildings, to meet our future needs and create livelihoods through investment that is rooted in the local community. Through existing projects Totnes residents (and beyond) have demonstrated their desire to share the risk, and the return, of establishing new local businesses, particularly social enterprises.

Totnes South West

Our objective is to bring the community together in the 3 community centres and to look how we can support each other and the community to improve health and healthy outcomes, crime & ASB issues and to involve the community in decision making, agency influencing and improving community cohesion and engagement. This will include cross community meetings, engaging and consulting with the community.

Hele and Lower Barton South West

This project is designed to put the heart back in to the Calne. This project is designed to go the next step in enabling Calne and its residents to understand its heritage, recognise its strengths, and celebrate its unique identity. It is also designed to demonstrate to potential visitors beyond Calne that it is place worth coming to by creating a legible landscape that can be interpreted and enjoyed. The project is about partner agencies working smarter together to improve the cultural and tourism offer in Calne, whilst retaining their individuality and specialisms.

Calne Community Area

South West

The Our Place project will enable us to work more closely in partnership with others to coordinate the Place Management work and deliver greater benefits together than would be achieved separately. Our work will include; Masterplan and Neighbourhood Plan, Business Improvement District, Active Leisure and Health Campus, Improving the environment and accessibility, Developing the Cultural offer, Improving the evening economy and public safety.

Trowbridge

South West

To develop a community led model for the provision of youth activities and support, enhancing the role of communities (via area boards) and young people (via youth advisory groups) to establish innovative and locally led approaches to designing and delivering services.

Wiltshire

South West

The Project will start with a comprehensive service mapping exercise, initially concentrating on the Martock East urban LSOA , to identify: ? what services are required; which are available and from whom; the gaps, including widening gaps as funding constraints force the County and District Councils to withdraw more from discretionary services and raise the bar of access to statutory services; the consequent risks to health, wellbeing, education, opportunities, family cohesion, public safety and community development; service delivery priorities. We will then move on to develop a cost-effective Operational Plan to fill the gaps and meet local priorities by, for example, new partnership delivery models, local commissioning, greater involvement of charities and the Voluntary and Community Sector, the training and employment of local groups and volunteers.

Martock, Somerset

South West

Link devolution of services, inc traffic management and income, to environmental, educational, young people's and community sustainability, services currently managed by our partners in seven other, distant authorities. Eight public authorities have been participating in Sensible Spending (participatory budgeting), localism initiatives, and a SIB/Locality supported holistic traffic management Business Case for community and environmental benefit. We wish to extend these initiatives into a comprehensive plan for localism.

Dulverton

South West

The project aims to address issues facing young people in the town, focusing on three key areas: social issues - for example antisocial behaviour and homelessness; employment and skills for example inability to access job centre nearest centre is 6 miles away, lack of careers advice in schools and general unpreparedness for the workplace of school leavers; health and wellbeing - Suicide and self-harm; smoking, alcohol and drug abuse; teenage pregnancy, mental and sexual health. We will work with a wide range of partners to draw in advice, support and services for young people, especially those facing challenging circumstances. Services will be focused on a new youth centre in the town which is currently being developed by the Town Council.

Dursley

South West

The core aim of the project is to improve access to employment and training opportunities within West Somerset, in particular in Williton and Watchet, by ensuring the provision of local services aligned to the needs of the community and local employers. The aim will be to increase educational attainment levels by engaging the local population in relevant skills based training. A priority of this project will be to address low aspirations, lack of motivation and intergenerational unemployment patterns within the community.

We want to involve local residents in Staple Hill in becoming part of the solution to the problems that people in Staple Hill face. There is an opportunity to take on the running of Staple Hill Old Primary school from the Council. There is no dedicated youth space in Staple Hill other than one evening a week in a small community room in a Church that caters predominantly for Church members. We believe this building has the potential to house a range of community led initiatives that will make the building sustainable and deliver services at the heart of this community, led and managed by local people.

Staple Hill South West

The vision is to improve the environment in which we live, improve the effectiveness of statutory services provided in Westgate Ward, narrow the gap in quality of life for local residents compared to the County and City as a whole, improve the business environment in the City Centre particularly for local traders.

Westgate Ward of Gloucester
City Council South West

The project aims to build a comprehensive support structure that will support children, young people and their families to achieve their full potential. Our ambition is to deliver a first rate support services that can help to transform the lives of people in our communities, in particular those in the areas that suffer from multiple forms of deprivation. Our priority is to improve the health and wellbeing of local residents to allow them to live longer, more fulfilling lives. In addition, we want to ensure that communities have the opportunity to have a greater say in the services that they receive.

Wellington and District South West

This project will develop and expand on the existing Cheltenham Inspiring Families (IF) project. IF brings together public and voluntary sector agencies and professionals to address issues for families with complex needs. The proposed project will prevent families getting to the stage where they require high level support. It will do this by working with families to set up peer led groups offering support and community cohesion opportunities.

Cheltenham

South West

The vision is to create an infrastructure through which all local voluntary and statutory and business sector agencies communicate and work together, and listen to the needs of local people. All new ideas, funding opportunities and emerging needs will be channelled through it.

Honiton

South West

With the local community and local partners in Newtown we aim to develop support for older people and other people with long term conditions. The support will be a low cost, sustainable and high quality alternative to many of the services currently available. Furthermore we want to ensure that local people can support their friends, family and neighbours in accessing this support, by developing a team of community volunteers and projects.

Newtown (Borough of Poole) South West

The Cranbrook 'Our Place' proposal would focus on involving local residents in improving Cranbrook's social and recreational landscape; health and wellbeing; economic development and skills and employment prospects. The aim would be to set up and manage a 'Community Market' as well as promoting healthy living through affordable cooking workshops in the Community Centre kitchen for example. Furthermore, a Food Bank linking up with other service providers to offer an array of employment focused support would be set up.

Cranbrook, Devon

South West

The main issue identified from consultation is a lack of a community hub to bring people together. There were also broader concerns around health, education and access to training/IT. Therefore more work is now required to pin down the underlying issues and engage residents fully in designing the improvements that will build on earlier successes and change things in the long term.

Westfield, Yeovil

South West

A Central community hub will be a new venture and created by the local residents of Penzance. The hub will encourage all local citizens to have their say on positive and negatives issues and gently challenge those volunteers to get involved and support local decisions . Information brought to the hub will be collated monthly and fed into the overall themes and issues on display for local residents of the Town. By listening to local residents the themes are real and lead onto action without imposed agendas from other agencies/ decision makers.

Penzance and outlining areas South West

The proposal is to develop a 'Parish Lengthsman Plus Scheme' to maintain and enhance local rural roads, footways and cycle ways. In summary, in the first instance Feock Parish Council working with Cornwall Council, the voluntary sector and other key stakeholders is keen to develop a new and innovative partnership that will ensure the day to day maintenance and improvement of the essential rural network of roads, paths and cycle ways in the Parish. The proposal will also make the network and the community more resilient to adverse weather, in particular flooding. This network is essential to the local community to access local services, promotes healthy lifestyles and also plays a key part in the local leisure and tourism industry.

Feock Parish

South West

The key aim of this project is to identify socially isolated individuals and make it easier for them to participate in the community at a level of their own choosing. This will include inter-generational work. Research, both nationally and locally, suggests that even where appropriate family and community structures exist, they are not accessed because of poor information, difficulties of transport and psychological barriers associated with entering 'new space'.

Greater Bedminster

South West

We want to better co-design and rewire local services in the Devizes Community Area Partnership for older people 60+. As a partnership our aim is to improve the health and wellbeing of older vulnerable and isolated people by creating services that tackle social isolation and improve wellbeing.

Devizes, Wiltshire

South West

In Northam and Westward Ho! there is a lack of services for families and young people. Transport to services outside the community are limited and not accessible for those on a low income. The aim of the project is to support residents to set up their own services including a youth club, after school homework support group, and to provide services to assist residents to improve skills for work and to help them provide activities to improve their locality.

South West

The key aim of the project is to reduce child poverty levels by co-producing services with the community and working in partnership with local businesses, social enterprises, schools, health, parish council and Local Authority.

Millbrook

South West

The overall intention of the project will be to co-ordinate the existing provision in the ward to make sure that resources are utilised as effectively as possible and to strengthen links with the local community. It is hoped this holistic approach with the local authorities, agencies and community will help to provide a focussed local long term plan to help to address the ward's deprivation issues and to close the gap between it and the rest of Cambridgeshire.

Waterlees

Eastern

The project aims to improve health and wellbeing for those living with long term health conditions (LTCs) along with a reduction in demand for primary health care services. The project will aim to secure the most appropriate local health services for those with LTC's, improving satisfaction amongst users and reducing the costs of meeting the needs for LTC's.

Kirkley Ward

Eastern

This project aims to mobilise communities to deliver sustainable economic growth, leading to a reduction in demand for expensive and unsustainable crisis intervention services.

Great Yarmouth

Eastern

The Our Witham Partnership seeks to address issues affecting children and young people aged 11-24 in the Witham area, focussing on ways to improve physical and mental health and wellbeing, and enhance employability and skills.

Witham

Eastern

To develop a social enterprise approach to long term unemployment. There are an increasing number of residents who have been claiming JSA for over 2 years living in the identified wards - up from 50 to 350 in 2 years. Our initial conversations with them have shown that the multiple barriers they face in returning to the workplace are not being effectively addressed by existing interventions. We aim initially to start up or acquire 2 local businesses with clear employment progression routes to other employers in the local economy, and employ a mix of skilled people to work within the business but also act as life coaches to a similar number of people who are employees who were previously long term unemployed.

Nelson and Central &
Northgate wards Great
Yarmouth

Eastern

Use the Our Place approach to bring together a very wide range of local partners and local residents to build a quantified operational plan that will ultimately see local people, through a local organisation that has democratic accountability (through its association with the Town Council) own a plan that will ensure that local people and local business properly benefit from the economic opportunities that the town has. In time we believe that Leiston and District Community Partnership has the potential to take on the delivery of an increasingly wide range of local public service delivery activities.

Leiston-cum-Sizewell

Eastern

The Early Help project is designed to support children and families when they first need help before they reach crisis point such as safeguarding issues and therefore complement the Government's troubled families agenda through reducing the number of families becoming troubled families.

South Norfolk/Diss Eastern

We would like to bring together public, private, voluntary & faith sectors to deliver services in a more co-ordinated, collaborative and community-led way, particularly for children, young people and families living in Eynesbury. We want to develop capacity within the community by supporting parents and young people to become leaders and facilitators of community activities. We want to bring together residents of all ages to build trust and understanding as local perceptions of anti-social behaviour (ASB) seem to be higher than ASB rates. We want to better use the assets that we have as there is no dedicated community centre.

Eynesbury, St Neots Eastern

Foxhill Forum wishes to develop a satellite Library service for the Foxhill neighbourhood that can benefit residents that are the hardest to reach. A designated area will be allocated for the Foxhill Satellite Library within Wolfe Road Healthy Living Centre, and this will be easily accessible for all visitors to the Centre. Various groups including Older 50s Activity Group, Mums & Toddler Group and even Community Learning classes will be able to access the service when they attend the Centre for their sessions, or even come into the Centre at different times in order to access the service.

Foxhill Neighbourhood Yorkshire & Humberside

The focus of the team is to provide more effective prevention and support, as well as effective enforcement, in particular to build better relationships with local residents, improve the physical environment, take a proactive approach to tackling crime and anti-social behaviour and better identify and support vulnerable people. As part of the work focused on this locality, as a Council we are working with, and are providing community development support, and premises (through the Community Asset Transfer Scheme) for Castle Community Network (CCN).

Our Vision: Together we build a community that determines its needs and owns and delivers services to meet them. Our Project Ambitions are to: 'Own/deliver a range of quality assured services/activities to meet identified local need.' Our aim is to provide healthy, inclusive and economically active neighbourhoods.

Peer navigators, mentors, and researchers will help vulnerable people to get support before they reach a crisis point.

The project will seek to support young members of the Penge community to enhance employability prospects through volunteering and community activism executed in a way that provides a range of transferable skills and training.

The Partnership Against Poverty (PAP) in Thamesmead programme brings together a diverse range of advice and support agencies to work in unison through a whole-place approach to reducing poverty in an area of significant deprivation in SE London. Through the Partnership Against Poverty programme, we will adopt a whole-place approach to create a single gateway through which our local residents can access and be signposted to all the different advice and support services available to meet their needs. This project is not about creating new services but about increasing the scale and reach of those already beginning to operate in the local area as well as building a concrete partnership structure to promote shared service planning; coordination of service delivery; signposting between organisations; and the sharing of resources such as building space and marketing materials. A central objective of the PAP project is to develop a comprehensive understanding of need and impact of services in the local area by providing a means through which data from a range of organisations can be centrally collated, layered and analysed to provide a robust data set that can help shape the delivery of services into the future.

We will help homeless people in the London borough of Kingston Upon Thames to enhance their employability, whilst pulling down barriers and stereotypes in the community through active volunteering. This is a novel proposal where homeless people themselves will be volunteering according to their skills and dreams.

We are a peer support project. We seek to improve community pathways; empowering residents to support each other to engage with and navigate local services with dignity and confidence rather than from positions of helplessness and passivity. Our ambition is for local people who feel sidelined and marginalized to become central to the human regeneration of Canning Town. We will support local residents to gain a confident sense of just how much they do have to contribute to this area as a qualitative living space.

A Jobs Hub would bring together statutory and voluntary services to support people to find employment and develop employability skills It would be a physical local centre to find out about jobs, disseminate practical information, advise on volunteering or benefits information, support with application forms and cvs and access to training. It would also address locally identified barriers such as language skills, health and childcare.

We would like to explore the viability of establishing a youth-led initiative in the Phoenix area of Bellingham, Downham and Whitefoot. Through the knowledge, skills and leadership at Phoenix Community Housing (PCH), we believe such an initiative could act as both a catalyst and vehicle for young people to co-produce, commission and deliver services in partnership with a range of voluntary, charitable and statutory sector bodies currently operating in the area. We believe this approach will support the creation of training, social action and entrepreneurial activities that both empower our young people and make a noticeable difference to the quality of neighbourhood liveability for all residents in these acknowledged deprived wards in the LB of Lewisham.

Well for Living plans to establish a new community sector-run, unified wellbeing facility in Leicester City. The partnership-run facility could provide various services/activities (e.g. arts, fitness, café, GP, clinical appointments, advocacy advice/information, self-help training) to Leicester's communities, particularly those currently supported by voluntary/community health and social care organisations. It would complement, not compete with, statutory health services, providing a range of wellbeing services and offer a base to deliver future additional services secured under the Right to Challenge or Bid.

Northampton Borough Council has handed over their community centres to the management of thirteen different local community groups, this move is believed to be one of the largest ever transfer of assets to community management. This has given local people the power to ensure that the centres provide services and facilities that meet the needs of their own local community and helps to secure the position of the centres at the heart of neighbourhood life. The project will involve a partnership between the Community Centres, Northampton Borough Council, Northampton Volunteering Centre (the Local Infrastructure Organisation) and the University of Northampton. The project will enable community consultation within the identified neighbourhoods to establish local priorities to develop local centre plans, as well as a combined overarching development plan for the community centres. The plans will support the use of the community centres, tailoring activities to suit the needs of the community, encourage volunteering, participation and activity to improve the quality of life for local residents. They will also provide support for income generation.

Northampton Borough (to be focused on neighbourhoods around Community Centres) East Midlands

Nottinghamshire Police and partners are leading on integrating and innovating the working practices of Public, Private and Voluntary Sector service providers in Nottinghamshire to prevent social problems (Prevent Strategy 2014-2017). This will transform future service delivery by encouraging partners (including commercial) to provide a brave, innovative approach to getting solutions right first time through a 'One Team?' approach. The aim is to co-produce ways of preventing social problems with the local community by building on local strengths and opportunities.

Sutton East: Outram Street and surrounding neighbourhoods East Midlands

The project seeks, as a starting point, to consult with residents to find out what they would like to see in the village to improve their 'health and well-being'. This project seeks to provide a series of programmes and events that will meet the needs of all ages and abilities using the facilities already in the village and bringing in new ones where necessary. The project would also seek to identify groups that may find exercising difficult - for instance those with young children - and through consultation - finding out projects that would suit them.
