

## **The Isle of Wight Council (Various Streets, Isle of Wight) (Speed Limits) Consolidation Order No 1 2018**

Notice is hereby given that the Isle of Wight Council in exercise of their powers under section 1(1), (2) and (3) and section 82, 84 (Section 5) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and with all other enabling power and after consultation with The Chief Officer of Police proposed to make an order, the effect of which will be:

1. To revoke the provisions of The Isle of Wight Council (Various Streets, Isle of Wight) (Speed Limits) Consolidation Order No 3 2017.
2. To re-enact the provisions contained therein subject to the following amendments:
3. To revoke the 40mph speed limit in the following lengths of road:
  - a. A3055 Leeson Road, Ventnor from a point 600 metres north-east to a point 200 metres south-west of the junction with Bonchurch Shute a distance of approximately 800 metres.
4. Under 'Section 82(2) (b) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984' the speed limit for the remaining length, will automatically revert to a 30mph speed limit.
5. No speed limit imposed by this order applies to vehicles falling within regulation 3(4) of the Road Traffic Exemptions (Special Forces) (Variation and Amendment) Regulations 2011 when used in accordance with regulation 3(5) of those regulations.

This Order is being proposed to avoid danger to persons or other traffic using the road or any other road or for preventing the likelihood of any such danger arising.

A copy of the draft Order, this Notice and the relevant plan may be inspected between normal office hours at the Customer Service Centre, County Hall, Newport, Isle of Wight during the objection period.
